MCCOY's Ready by 21 Quality Counts initiative is focused on improving the quality and reach of youth programs and strengthening local policies that guide

resource allocation, accountability and workforce development. As one of only 12 sites nationally, MCCOY is directing the local effort to engage our community, assess leadership and program capacity, identify policy priorities, and build momentum for quality improvement, leading to better outcomes for youth.

MCCOY has created a series of Community Compacts for Youth based on the core components of the Quality Counts initiative: the policy, resource and leadership landscape, program quality, the program landscape, and the youth-serving workforce. These Compacts outline ways that both individuals and organizations throughout the community can increase the odds of success for local youth.

Customized for each sector, they include three levels of commitment – Supporter, Adopter and Advocate. From simply learning about what makes a quality program to adopting family-friendly policies, the Compacts offer a way for our community to take action and make a difference for youth.



Healthcare Provider Compact for Youth

Level 1

Supporter

- * We will support coordinated decision making on issues and policies that effect youth within our organization and in the greater community.
- * We will support partnerships and policies that expand the reach of health-focused and general youth programming as well as access to and participation in youth programs.
- * We will support quality youth programs by educating our leadership and staff about the characteristics and value of high-quality programming.
- * We will support positive youth outcomes by educating ourselves and our staff about the impact and characteristics of highly competent youth workers.

Level 2

Adopter

In addition to Level 1 efforts:

- * We will adopt organizational policies that encourage staff engagement in their children's lives and align planning with a focus on positive outcomes for youth.
- * We will adopt programs based in positive youth development and offer young people medically accurate information.
- * We will adopt internal policies and support external policies that emphasize the recruitment and development of highly effective youth workers.

Level 3

Advocate

In addition to Level 1 & 2 efforts:

- * We will advocate to community leadership for public policies that reflect a coordinated, shared vision for the well-being of youth in our community and that actively engage youth and families.
- * We will advocate to community leaders to increase the reach, quality, and impact of youth programs in our community.
- * We will advocate to the public as well as community leadership about why a highly competent youth development workforce supports the achievement of outcomes for young people, both health-related and otherwise.
